Ed Kinder, blues and jazz pianist has been performing for over 40 years. A self-taught pianist, Ed is also an alumnus of the Berklee School of Music.




Paul Golden, has entertained audiences throughout the world. Broadway tunes to standard favorites, Paul will bring you back to a time when music was music.



Each month NEWSBITS will highlight one of our residents who have been active volunteers over time, not only here at Lakehouse West, but throughout their lives!



Bernie Ehrlich, a man known by many to be a crusader and a humanitarian, has lived his life with a mission and a purpose. Although selfless and modest, his life- long achievements have impacted the lives of many Americans. After serving in the Navy during World War II, Bernie completed law school and became a part of a team of speech writers for President Harry Truman. In 1943, he helped fine tune and modify the GI Bill which gave veterans a broad range of services as well as an opportunity to get an education and employment. Through his lobbying activities he cultivated numerous contacts in Washington, among them the administrators of the Holocaust Museum.

He didn’t hesitate to help a local Synagogue plan a Holocaust Remembrance Program which led to six years of programs. In 2006, he corralled a local religious figure into supporting a public awareness program called “Humanity Working To End Genocide”. Groups from Dafur, Rowanda and Sarajevo shared their stories with Sarasota audiences.

In 2017, he was honored by the Association Of Retired Attorneys, where he served five years as President. The purpose of the association was to promote, on a volunteer, non political basis, the advantages of justice within the state of Florida.

Bernie has always believed that it is our responsibility as citizens to get involved in our community. This inspired him to create and oversee our Town Hall meetings: inviting a resident to speak on a subject that would be educational and motivating. He felt strongly that many residents needed to have a reason to get out of their apartments for an occasion that was meaningful. To date there have been 36 programs with 22 resident speakers!

Our admiration for Bernie, for all that he has done for us and for our country, knows no bounds and deserves our recognition and appreciation. His is a life well lived. We look to him with immense pride, and we are honored that he is our neighbor and our friend.
