Laboratory Services



Residents may have their blood pressure checked at any time the Health Center is open.




Podiatrist Services



At Your Service





Lakehouse West can assist you with iphone, ipad, and computer operating technology.

This service is free and is for operating assistance only-not repair.

Lakehouse West can also assist you with Face time/Skype on an iPad so you can stay connected and see the faces of your family and friends. If you would like to set up an appointment for either of these services, sign up in the Events Book.



In the **Business Office** you can cash a check for up to \$80.00, buy stamps and mail packages. Notary services, faxing and copying are also available. The Business Office is open Monday-Friday from 9:00 am-12:00 pm. and is located off the Great Hall on the 1st fl.

There are 4 **Guest Apartments** available, for a fee, per night. To reserve a guest room, contact the Business Office Manager for guest room details. You may charge this to your Lakehouse West account or pay by personal check; credit cards are not accepted.

Maintenance: If you have a problem in your apartment, call the Front Desk. The receptionist will complete a work order for you. A maintenance staff member will call you to arrange a time to assess the problem and solve it in a timely manner. Please do not stop a member of maintenance in the hallway..he's probably on his way to help someone else!





Laundry Rooms are located on every floor and are open between 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. daily. If you need assistance operating the washers or dryers, please ask a housekeeping staff member, or a neighbor. If you have guests, be sure that they know how they work too. Please do not leave laundry in the machine and go to the movies! Someone else may be waiting to use it. If you use an iron, be sure to unplug it when you are finished.

Recycle Rooms are located throughout the building. There are separate bins for paper/ cardboard, and another for recyclable plastic and glass. There is a separate place for old hearing aid batteries. Please refer to the signs on the wall that explain what-goes-where. Items like coat hangers and carpeting should be placed on the floor near the bins. Clothing, linens, and food-not-suitable for the garbage disposal in your apartment should be placed in a plastic bag, tied, and dropped down the chute marked "Garbage". If you have guests, be sure they follow the guidelines.





The **Hair Salon**, ext. 523, is located on the 2nd floor near the main elevator. The Salon is open Monday-Saturday from 9:00 a.m. until the last appointment. Closed Sunday. Manicures and facials are also available.

Newspaper: If you would like to arrange for newspaper delivery, at your expense, call the Sarasota Herald-Tribune. Newspapers are delivered directly to resident apartments.

Dining Do's & Don'ts



Dining is a very important part of the Lakehouse West experience. It's one of the best ways to get to know your new neighbors and make friends. Noted below are Dining procedures, that <u>currently</u> may be different.. You may contact Janine Owens, Dining Room Manager, at ext. 521 for more information.

Breakfast is not served expect for special events.

Coffee and Danish are available in the lounge area everyday from 9:30-11 a.m.

Lunch is served between 12:00 & 1:30 p.m. No reservation is required. The dress code is relaxed. Shorts and tasteful shirts are allowed. (no swimsuits)

Dinner is served at 5:00, 5:30, & 6:00 p.m. Only the noon meal is served on holidays: i.e., New Year's Day, Easter, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas.

Reservations for dinner are required. You may make a reservation "independently" in the lounge area by 1:00 p.m. daily. For delivery service to your apartment, menus are available near the main elevator on every floor and must be completed by 9:30 a.m. for all meals. Be sure to specify your delivery time preference.



Dinner Dress Code for men is slacks (no shorts) and a collared shirt. Ladies are expected to wear clothes that complement those of men. (t-shirts, jeans, workout clothes and hats are not allowed) Jackets for men are required for special events and holidays. (You will be notified) If you are entertaining guests, please make them aware of our dress code. The use of cell phones is not allowed in the Dining Room.

Welcome Tables are hosted by residents on Wednesdays to welcome new residents and introduce them to others. These tables are by invitation only. You will be contacted by hosts/hostesses for invitation to dinner.



Weekly Menus are placed in your "cubby" in the mail area of the Great Hall.



A Private Dining Room where residents may arrange a private dinner for up to 14 guests is available by reservation. The fee for this is charged to your account. Contact the Food & Beverage Director for details & menu planning. This is a nice way to celebrate special occasions with family & friends.

There is no tipping for service! Once a year residents contribute (usually late October) to a "Holiday Fund" that

is distributed to the staff (housekeeping, servers, kitchen, activities, maintenance, drivers, etc.) in December. This is a voluntary initiative, but a wonderful way for residents to express their appreciation for the excellent services they receive from the staff all year long.



Coffee & Conversation" happens every day in the lounge area of the Great Hall from 9:30-11:00 am. It's a great way to get acquainted with other residents in a casual setting. (both coffee & Danish are available)
