


Concert by Carol Sparrow, Mezzo-Soprano & Lee Dougherty Ross, pianist.








LIVING BETTER WITH HEARING LOSS

Topic: Laughter Is The Best Medicine





The Jewish calendar begins again each year with Rosh Hashanah (literally, "the head of the year"). Celebrating the New Year also signals the beginning of the High Holy Days, with Yom Kippur, Sukkot and the concluding holidays in the following weeks. Observance of the



New Year includes the sounding of the Shofar and eating apples with honey for a sweet new year. Although the High Holy Days are primarily centered in the synagogue, all are invited to attend this brief discussion of the holiday, hear the voice of the Shofar, and share apples with honey, and a glass of wine, in celebration.


