What is the Holiday Fund?

In 1985, residents of Lakehouse West met to see how best they could show appreciation to all the employees who take care of us. The "no tipping" policy presents a challenge! The list of hourly employees is endless, from housekeepers to servers, cooks, and dishwashers, maintenance staff, bus drivers, guard house

attendants and more. A holiday fund was established. Residents receive requests for donations in October & November. Checks made out to the Lakehouse West Residents Association may be given in a sealed envelope to one of the Holiday Fund committee members. Our office calculates the number of hours each employee has worked, and each employee is given a check based on that calculation, The cut off date for donations is November 19. The most frequently asked question is "How much should we give?" In the last few years, the average donation per person has been about \$500 for the year, or pro-rated for less than a year in residence. 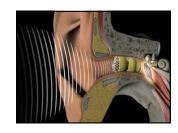

Cheers for Volunteers!

A volunteer is a person who willingly undertakes a meaningful task that benefits others. NEWSBITS has regularly featured a resident with a strong volunteer background. At John Dionne's request, Helen Fleder has agreed to write on her own volunteer experiences.



Helen Fleder was fortunate to have enjoyed three professional careers, as a ballet dancer and fitness instructor, sculptor and writer. She began volunteering when she was only 17 and was asked to teach both ballroom dancing to the freshmen cadets at West Point Military Academy, and ballet to the officer's children, replacing a teacher who was ill. After this experience, she was determined to meet any new challenge when volunteering without fear or trepidation! In the 1950's, married and raising three young children, she taught ballet classes to the local Girl Scouts eventually becoming their Vice President, focusing on developing community service programs for the girls. She also took a major role raising money for her children's schools through the PTA, performing and choreographing for local shows, and helping to produce a community arts festival which included students, staff and parents. In the 1960's she began an exciting volunteer career as a dance therapist. With some exceptional training in that field, she was able to use her love for dance and creative movement to connect with the patients with whom she worked. It began working with children in foster care, then with children with learning disabilities, at which time she received a citation for her work. She held movement workshops for the blind, as well as for troubled teen age girls

at the Westchester Behavioral Center. Her most memorable experience was using movement as a means of nonverbal communication for patients in the Bronx Psychiatric Hospital and with short term patients in a general hospital in Port Chester. In 1978 after discovering an aptitude for art, she joined the "Return to Innocence" program for the memory impaired in Sarasota, using collage as a means of communicating with the patients. In 1997, when she became an active member of the Sarasota Arts Council, she was awarded a citation for developing "Street Studios" where over 100 local artists exhibited their work on "Arts Day". This inspired her to try to raise money to bring some of the artists into local schools, offering free after-school art classes to students who could benefit from an art experience. Helen volunteered for several years with the Sarasota Ballet and organized a semi-annual food drive for All Faiths Food Bank for residents of Palm Aire Country Club community. In 1996 she helped to organize a Palm Aire Arts Council, setting up annual resident art shows. At that time she formed a walking- for -exercise program for the residents. In 1978, Helen wrote her first fitness book, "Shower Power" about stretches one can do in a shower or bath, focusing on the importance of maintaining good posture. Represented as Gillette's fitness consultant, she spoke on television and radio about the role of posture to our health and well being. Her stretching exercises were published in McCalls, Glamour and Self magazines. Helen has lectured to many groups including the Bernie Ehrlich Lecture Series here at Lakehouse West relating to her second book "Shape Up! As you sit, stand and walk! In 1997 she was awarded by the Sarasota Community Foundation for "a lifetime of volunteering". A tree was planted in her honor in back of the Phillippi Creek mansion. She used the money to hire a facilitator for an after-school art workshop at Lakewood Ranch High School. After moving to Lakehouse West, she created and directed the "Lakehouse West Players" for a group of our residents who enjoyed reading poetry and essays. The group performed during many holiday events including Christmas, Thanksgiving and Veterans' Day. In 2019, she organized our first clothing drive, and in 2021 helped form the "Notable Knitters" who knit and crochet for charity. (For the past year, Helen has contributed to our monthly publication, NEWSBITS, interviewing residents who, over the years have made a difference in other people's lives through their years of volunteering). Helen's last project was writing and directing the show "Hey, Look Me Over!" which gave her the opportunity to write parody's to songs about our staff and residents and gave the cast the opportunity to perform. Helen feels grateful for the many opportunities that she has been afforded, to share her interests in a way that might make a difference in other peoples' lives. She believes that no matter our age, we all need to seek a purpose in life, be it major or relatively insignificant. Taking control of our time, volunteering when we can, means living life to the fullest and getting the most out of every day!
